A2. Listening to Interact: interpret messages accurately while interacting in French for a variety of purposes and with diverse audiences;	To prepare students for interacting in French, within our speaking lessons for each unit, students are required to listen to a series of questions based on the topic and record their answer. Students can listen back to their recordings and self assess and then re-record their answer if they choose to. B1. Speaking to Communicate: communicate information and ideas orally in French, using a variety of speaking strategies and age- and grade-appropriate language suited to the purpose and audience;	In each of our levelled, topic-based units we have a speaking lesson which includes activities focusing on both pronunciation and communication. The pronunciation sections require students to record themselves saying words and sentences which they can then compare to a model answer recorded by a native speaker. The communication sections require students to listen to a series of questions and record their answer, then listen to a series of answers and record a question that might get that answer. Finally there are a series of conversation and monologue tasks that the students record about the topic. Teachers are able to easily create additional speaking tasks to meet their needs and they can listen back to what the students have recorded and give them feedback. Our introduction lessons for each unit introduce useful language to support students in their speaking skills and also model correct pronunciation of kep vocabulary.	<text><section-header></section-header></text>
